What We Believe

The Articles of Faith in the Baptist Church

- **I. The Scriptures.** We believe that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error for its matter; that it reveals the principles by which God will judge us, and therefore is, and shall remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions shall be tried.
- **II. The True God.** We believe the Scriptures teach that there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit, whose name is Jehovah, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor confidence and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.
- III. The Fall of Man. We believe the Scriptures teach that Man was created in holiness, under the law of his Maker; but by voluntary transgressions fell from that holy and happy state; in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners, not by constraint but choice; being by nature utterly void of that holiness required by the law of God, positively inclined to evil; and therefore under just condemnation to eternal ruin, without defense or excuse.
- **IV.** The Way of Salvation. We believe that the Scriptures teach that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God; who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon him our nature, yet without sin; honored the divine law by his personal obedience, and by his death made a full atonement for our sins; that having risen from the dead, he is now enthroned in heaven; and uniting in his wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfections, he is in every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate, and an all-sufficient Savior.
- **V. Justification.** We believe the Scriptures teach that the great Gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in him is justification; that justification includes the pardon of sin, and the promise of eternal life on principles of righteousness; that it is bestowed, not in consideration of any works of righteousness which we have done, but solely through faith in the Redeemer's blood; by virtue of which faith his perfect righteousness is freely imputed to us of God; that it brings us into a state of most blessed peace and favor with God, and secures every other blessing needful for time and eternity.
- **VI. The Freeness of Salvation.** We believe that the Scriptures teach that the blessings of salvation are made free to all by the Gospel; that it is the immediate duty of all to accept them by cordial, penitent and obedient faith; and that nothing prevents the salvation of the greatest sinner on earth, but his own determined depravity and voluntary rejection of the Gospel; which rejection involves him in an aggravated condemnation.

- VII. Regeneration. We believe that the Scriptures teach that in order to be saved, sinners must be regenerated, or born again; that regeneration consists in giving a holy disposition to the mind that it is effected in a manner above our comprehension by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the Gospel; and that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith, and newness of life.
- VIII. Repentance and Faith. We believe the Scriptures teach that repentance and faith are sacred duties, and also inseparable graces, wrought in our souls by the regenerating Spirit of God; whereby being deeply convinced of our guilt, danger and helplessness and of the way of salvation by Christ, we turn to God with unfeigned contrition, confession, and supplication for mercy; at the same time heartily receiving the Lord Jesus Christ as our prophet, priest and king, and relying on him alone as the only and all-sufficient Savior.
- **IX. God's Purpose of Grace.** We believe the Scriptures teach that election is the eternal purpose of God, according to which he graciously regenerates, sanctifies and saves sinners; that being perfectly consistent with the free agency of man, it comprehends all the means in connection with the end; that it is a most glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, being infinitely free, wise, holy and unchangeable; that it utterly excludes boasting and promotes humility, love, prayer, praise, trust in God, and active imitation of his free mercy; that it encourages the use of means in the highest degree; that it may be ascertained by its effects in all who truly believe the Gospel; that it is the foundation of Christian assurance; and that to ascertain it with regard to ourselves demands and deserves the utmost diligence.
- **X. Sanctification.** We believe the Scriptures teach that Sanctification is the process by which, according to the will of God, we are made partakers of his holiness; that it is a progressive work; that it is begun in regeneration; and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, the Sealer and Comforter, in the continual use of the appointed means especially the word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness, and prayer.
- **XI. Perseverance of the Saints.** We believe the Scriptures teach that such only are real believers as endure to the end; that their persevering attachment to Christ is the grand mark which distinguishes them from superficial professors; that a special Providence watches over their welfare; and they are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.
- XII. The Law and Gospel. We believe the Scriptures teach that the Law of God is the eternal and unchangeable rule of his moral government; that it is holy, just and good; and that the inability which the Scriptures ascribe to fallen men to fulfill its precepts, arise entirely from their love of sin; to deliver them from which, and to restore them through a Mediator to unfeigned obedience to the holy Law, is one great end of the Gospel, and of the Means of Grace connected with the establishment of the visible church.
- XIII. A Gospel Church. We believe the Scriptures teach that a visible church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the Gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by his laws; and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word; that its only scriptural officers are Bishops or Pastors, and Deacons whose Qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistles to Timothy and Titus.

XIV. Baptism and the Lord's Supper. We believe the Scriptures teach that Christian baptism is the immersion in water of a believer, into the name of the Father, and Son, and Holy Ghost; to show forth in a solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in the crucified, buried, and risen Savior, with its effect, in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is prerequisite to the privileges of a church relation; and to the Lord's Supper, in which the members of the church, by the sacred use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ; preceded always by solemn self-examination.

XV. The Christian Sabbath. We believe the Scriptures teach that the first day of the week is the Lord's Day, or Christian Sabbath, and is to be kept sacred to religious purposes, by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations, by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public, and by preparation for that rest that remained for the people of God.

XVI. Civil Government. We believe the Scriptures teach that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interest and good order of human society; and that magistrates are to be prayed for, conscientiously honored, and obeyed; except only in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the Prince of the Kings of the earth.

XVII. Righteous and Wicked. We believe the Scriptures teach that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and sanctified by the Spirit of our God, are truly righteous in his esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and unbelief are in his sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death.

XVIII. The World to Come. We believe the Scriptures teach that the end of the world is approaching; that at the last day, Christ will descend from heaven, and raise the dead from the grave for final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place; that the wicked will be adjudged to endless punishment, and the righteous to endless joy; and that this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness.

THE CHURCH COVENANT

Having been led, as we believe by the Spirit of God, to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior; and, on the profession of our faith, having been baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we do now, in the presence of God, angels and this assembly, most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another as one body in Christ.

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to walk together in Christian love; to strive for the advancement of this church in knowledge and holiness; to give place in our affections, prayers, and services above every organization of human origin; to sustain its worship, ordinances, discipline, and doctrines; to contribute cheerfully and regularly, as God has prospered us, toward its expenses for the support of a faithful and evangelical ministry among us, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the gospel throughout the world. In case of a difference of opinion in the church, we will strive to avoid a contentious spirit, and if we cannot unanimously agree, we will cheerfully recognize the right of the majority to govern.

We also engage to maintain family and secret devotions, to study diligently the Word of God; to religiously educate our children; to seek the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances; to walk circumspectly in the world; to be kind and just to those in our employ, and faithful in the service we promise others; endeavoring in the purity of heart and goodwill towards all men to exemplify and commend our holy faith.

We further engage to watch over, to pray for, to exhort and stir up each other unto every good word and work; to guard each other's reputation, not needlessly exposing the infirmity of others; to participate in each other's joys, and with tender sympathy, bear one another's burdens and sorrows; to cultivate Christian courtesy; to be slow to give or take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, being mindful of the rules of the Savior in the eighteenth chapter of Matthew, to secure it without delay; and through life, amid evil report, to seek to live to the glory of God, who hath called us out of darkness into His marvelous light.

We moreover engage that when we remove from this place, we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word.

Join us weekly for Saturday Church School beginning at 9:00 AM with continental breakfast followed by biblical lesson study at 9:30 am for the entire family (toddler thru

adult) concluding at 10:30 am. The lessons are engaging, interactive and the Word of God is transformative.

The Sunday School Winter Quarter (December 2024-February 2025) entitled "A King Forever and Ever" explores the broad sweep of biblical teaching about God's reign and connects to Jesus as the earthly exhibition of the divine kingdom.

December 2024 - Unit I: "Jesus, The Heir of David"

Lessons at a Glance

Lesson 1 - December 1 - "The Ancestry of King David" (Ruth 4:9-17; Luke 3:23, 31b-32)

People belong to families that extend across generations. Jesus' and King David's family tree features an unlikely marriage between Boaz and Ruth, serving as a testimony to the wideness of God's grace to effect divine purposes.

Lesson 2 - December 8 - "God's Promise to David" (2 Samuel 7:4-17)

People value permanence and seek to build structures that will outlast themselves. When David wanted to build a house for God, God promised to build a "house" for David— a neverending kingdom!

Lesson 3 - December 15 - "The Prophet Who Prepares The Way" (Luke 1:67-80)

In times of trouble, people require rescue. Who can save us in such times? Zechariah prophesied that his son, John would prepare the way for the coming Savior who would redeem Israel.

Lesson 4 - December 22 - "Born In The City of David" (Luke 2:1-16)

Everyone likes to hear good news. God announced the Good News of Jesus' birth to shepherds who were amazed at hearing it.



My Faith Journey With Breast Cancer Deacon Mary D. Hegazy

"Mary, you have 2 malignant lesions in your left breast with lymph node involvement." These are the words that changed my life and began my journey with Breast Cancer on August 23, 2023. As I heard these words, I closed my eyes, took a deep breath and called on the Lord to please help The radiologist, a believer, was very comforting and reassuring as I was slowly unraveling in her office. My mind was going in about 50 different directions; what are my options? How will I work and support myself? Who will help me in my care with my mother and husband both gone? Will there be pain? What is my prognosis?" I prayed for strength and received comfort in knowing the Lord has brought me this far and He will never leave me. My answer in prayer was a resounding "Faith". I began the journey of faith with God leading the way.

How did we get here? In November 2022, I discovered a large hematoma in my left breast after an incident where a patient had trapped me between the desk and stretcher. In time, the

hematoma subsided so I thought that was it. Later in May 2023, I received an injury to the same breast area when I was lifting boxes while moving. This time the lump did not go away but got larger. I had to find a PCP and sought medical advice. As soon as she examined my breast, I could tell by the look on her face that something was not right. She sent me for a diagnostic mammogram at Crozer Medical Center. I kept reviewing my healing bible verses and kept my war cries in my heart as I was waiting for results from several mammograms and ultrasounds. Yes, I was preparing for the Medical Professionals' reports. Ultimately, I was depending on the word from my Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ....the Healer.

I was diagnosed with HER2 positive (L) breast invasive ductal carcinoma, Grade II, staged at 1B. Grade II is early breast cancer but has moved into other breast areas or lymph nodes. My tumor was staged at 1b due to lymph node involvement and the size of the tumors. Genetic testing was negative for the hereditary BRCA mutation.

It was explained to me that HER2 is a breast

protein that controls how fast the cells grow and this divide. When occurs too quickly, uncontrolled growths and tumors can develop. Positive means that although HER2 is an aggressive form of breast cancer, my cancer cells are responsive to many types of hormones and should be easier for treatment. (Praise God!) I chose Fox Chase at Brinton Lake as my cancer treatment center. As a nurse, I worked with Dr. Rousch, the Medical-Oncologist and Dr. Gilday, the Breast Cancer Surgeon. Their work was outstanding, so I felt comfortable, which is extremely important on this journey. Dr. Rousch sent me for further MRIs, where my allergy to MRI contrast was discovered. I also went for PET Scan, CT scan of Abdomen and Pelvis, EKG, Echocardiogram and Bone Scan. My scans revealed no lesions or areas of concern outside of

My team also presented my case before the tumor board which included Oncology teams from Sloan-Kettering and the Mayo Clinic. This procedure can alleviate the precious time

the breast and I was grateful to God (a God

sighting!).

arranging for second opinions. The Team and I agreed to a round of chemotherapy before partial mastectomy, radiation therapy, plastic surgery evaluation and finishing adjunctive treatment. They estimated 1.5 years active treatment, and possible 2–5 years hormone treatment. My first chemotherapy began on November 1, 2023, with Her2 positive medication course of IV infusions of

Pertuzumab/Trastuzumab/Taxotere/Carboplatin and Phesgo once every 3 weeks. I was also given Nyvepria to make more WBCs.

Well, I developed severe side effects to the medications. I experienced uncontrollable bouts of nausea, vomiting and diarrhea for two months. Additionally, I developed thrush and difficulty swallowing. I had several medications to address these side effects, but they were slow working. I became so weak that I couldn't walk distances (few steps) without becoming short of breath. My condition was now severe, and I became disabled from work and suffered many falls. My Echocardiogram revealed decreasing cardiac function.

I depended more and more on God. The daily scripture lessons from Rev. Owen and the Canaan for Life Ministry of the Word gave me comfort and strength. Sometimes when I heard the morning message alert notification, I praised God for another day and grateful to have made it through the night. There was a book of prayers. One-Minute Prayers for Women with Cancer that helped me draw closer to God. Also, I would read from a pamphlet, What Cancer Can't Do, along with healing bible verses and listen to my War Cries during treatment. From womensday.com, I turned to a "Prophetic Prayer for Healing – Dear Jesus, be near me in my time of weakness and pain; sustain me by your grace, that my strength and courage may not fail. "

I remember one episode that I was grateful to know Jesus as my Savior. While in bed, my mind was consumed with ruminating thoughts. We are taking so many different medications; it is hard to know what effect they are having on our mental wellness. I heard a voice berating me and speaking "you're almost dead anyway, you might as well just go ahead and die!" Well, it happened so fast I screamed out "Jesus help me", grabbed

the Bible from the bedside table and began to read the Word out loud. As I read Ephesians 6:10-18, my life scripture, the air cleared as if my ears were becoming unclogged, and the evil speak stopped. Hallelujah Lord Jesus. I kept reading the scripture until the air cleared. I praised God and reanointed my home with oil. I was also grateful that our Cancer Center had a mental health wellness group for guidance.

My team readjusted my medication regimen and that helped me. I was finally able to complete the round of chemotherapy in preparation for Under the direction of Dr. Gilday, surgery. Surgeon and Dr. Fernandez, Plastic Surgeon, I had a (L) breast invasive carcinoma – resection. During the surgery, Dr. Fernandez, performed lympho-venous anastomosis to reduce the incidence of lymphedema. Surgery lasted 4.5 hours. The Pathology report showed that of the 24 lymph nodes removed, only 6 had involvement. No new margins and invasive carcinoma were not present. Report showed positive response to chemotherapy. (God sighting! Thank you Lord)

My next step was radiation therapy while receiving the 2nd round of chemotherapy. Dr. Lamond was my Radiation Oncologist. I received 7 weeks of radiation/5 days a week M-F while receiving chemotherapy once every 3 weeks. My reaction to this round of chemotherapy was harsh. I developed severe dehydration leading to electrolyte imbalance and acute kidney injury. My church members were able to give me rides to the chemo center for daily IV fluids, medications and electrolyte therapy.

I continued with morning meditations and so grateful to God to get through the night hours when I had the most difficulty. One night, I remember becoming so weak falling out on the bathroom floor and being unable to move or walk to get to help. I completely surrendered it all to God because I could not vomit or anything else one more time. So weak, I repented to God and forgave myself. I released to God that it was well with me if I returned to Him now or if God decided for me to remain on Earth. I felt a feeling of release and woke up 4 hours later, still on the floor. As I awakened, I could hear a Pastor

emphatically preaching about the Power of the Holy Spirit on YouTube on the TV. As I listened, I could feel power filling my body and I was able to crawl to the phone and reach out to the chemo center. (God sighting!) My church member gave me a cane and took me to the clinic. I received emergency treatment, and the team adjusted my treatment regimen.

It is important to mention that the complexity of cancer treatment can significantly impact one's financial situation. As I was on extended leave from work, I lost my medical insurance in the middle of treatment and thank God for the Affordable Care Act. Several of my disability checks from work never came or were delayed, so I depleted my savings. I am grateful to my co-workers who gave me a donation that helped during this period. Praise God for Canaan Baptist Church Benevolence Ministry and the Bringing Hope Home Foundation that provided me with assistance to prevent eviction. Always grateful to my Deacon who took me to the Social Security Administration and helped me to apply for my retirement benefits so I would have an income. That check was direct deposit the next day. (A God sighting, thank You Lord.) I praise God for countless church members who gave me individual donations, care, gifts and blessings to help me through. God is a provider, and He sends ministering angels to keep us. Yes, we are not alone.

If it had not been for my Canaan Baptist Church members during this period, I would have become destitute. So grateful for Pastor Bullock's sermon series of guidance and encouragement. I have often reviewed points from the "Repeat Performance" sermon; my faith in God's Power to change my circumstance will determine my outcome. So grateful to first lady, Rev. Dr. Debbie, who took time to lay hands on me as she walked by me as she was preparing for her ordination service. My church family members who rescued me when my car was repossessed, I will ever thank God for you. The Deacons. Missionaries and Health/Nurses Ministries have looked after me and given me gifts and meals. The Canaan for Life Ministry who provided me with resource information as well as companionship and welcomed me. My church member drove me to Brinton Lake and waited with me when I was sick as we didn't know if I would have to go to the hospital. I was worried but she told me, "I won't leave you". My church family, my heart has been touched by your outpourings of love, cards, hugs and smiles. Yes, Canaan Baptist Church membership has its privileges and benefits.

Well, this journey continues. I'm currently in adjuvant therapy chemotherapy with Kadcyla IV infusion and oral Arimidex. I will be on Kadcyla until February 2025 and then the plan is to have my porta Cath removed. I shouted for joy when the team, my Radiation Oncologist, Medical Oncologist and Plastic Surgeon who joined by FaceTime assembled when I completed radiation therapy to tell me they got all the cancer, outside areas are clear and positive response to chemotherapy and radiation therapy. My repeat PET Scan was clear. Praise God, I rang the bell! (A God sighting).

I'm encouraged that this journey has afforded me the opportunity to grow closer to God. I have faced God providing for me and He has taught me that He is control of all things. We have a silent prayer group at the Chemo Center, and I am glad to serve with them. We are assigned a topic, and we pray on our own silently for the time identified. It is a blessing. We can share a praise report if the Holy Spirit leads.

I cannot imagine moving through this season without knowing how to turn and trust in Jesus. Thank you for this opportunity to share my story. If by chance you are reading this and you don't know Jesus Christ as Savior, try Jesus while we are trying everything else. He will come through. My heart is uplifted by the goodness of God to keep me. As CeCe Winans sings to "The Goodness of God"—"All my life You have been faithful, and all my life You have been so, so good; with every breath that I am able, oh, I will sing of the goodness of God." Hallelujah and Amen.

The Season of Advent

"For everything its season and for every activity under heaven its time."—Ecclesiastes 3:1 "Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth;" —Isaiah 43:19

Christians throughout history have marked major events in the life of Christ, the church, and God's people. The Baptist church has two significant celebrations, Christmas and Easter. Canaan is doing a new thing by embracing a liturgical calendar year in the African American culture and Baptist church tradition. To stimulate the senses of where we are spiritually, as a church family, at various times throughout the year, we aim to make the gospel more meaningful and applicable to our Christian life. Because we live in a world that moves through seasons, we can adjust by having different expectations and finding different hopes in each season. With Pastor Bullock's guidance, the Holy Bible, and other relevant sources, a customized Christian calendar has been developed for the Canaan Church. The 2024-2025 liturgical year begins with the Advent season marking the preparation for and anticipation of the birth of Jesus Christ based on Luke 1-24. On Sunday, December 1, we kick off the Advent season.

What is Advent? Advent means the arrival of Jesus of Nazareth. Furthermore, the Advent season is a time of celebration and thankfulness as we prepare spiritually for the anniversary of Christ's birth or Christmas day. The Advent wreath is on display in the Canaan sanctuary. Its circular shape represents the eternity of God – there is no beginning or end to His love. This wreath is made up of evergreens representing everlasting life and the love we find in Jesus. The candles represent Jesus as He is the Light of the World and God's promise of salvation through Christ. Their colors are purple, rose/pink, and white. On the four Sundays of Advent, we light a candle, each having a theme – hope, peace, joy, and love. On Christmas Day, December 25th, we will light a white candle that represents the life of Christ. The color white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Savior. Be sure to join us each Sunday in December for the Advent Liturgy starting at 9:40 AM. May the God of hope fill us with joy and peace as we trust in Him so that we may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
